Loy: What's up everyone! It's Loy

Calla: And Calla!

Loy: We've got a fun exciting workshop that will teach you a lot about some awards that you probably don't know about. Specifically, State Superior Chapter Award, Golden State Degree, and Power of One. Don't know what they are? It's okay, you'll have plenty of knowledge on them after this brisk workshop.

Calla: Does anyone know what the State Superior Chapter Award is? Well does anyone know how to fill out an application for this award? Do you know what this award is given for? That's totally fine, hopefully after this workshop you will know exactly what to do.

Loy: The State Superior Chapter Award is given to chapters that are rewarded for simply being active! All you need to do is put a check next to the boxes that apply to your chapter. Some of the criteria may include chapters fundraising, having regular chapter meetings, and participating in at least one major activity during FCCLA week.

Calla: That's right! These forms can often be filled out quite quickly if you know the activities your chapter involves themselves in. There are three levels of this award: Bronze, Silver, and Gold. Annnnd your chapter gets recognized in front of everyone during the conference.

Loy: We hope you all go and apply to get this amazing award to earn recognition for your chapter at State Leadership Conference. We're actually going to fill them out right now! Please feel free to ask the State Officers if you need help with anything. I know it may be tricky to know these facts about your chapter, but make sure you hold onto this paper!

Calla: Alright, how about we do a little ice breaker. Alright this icebreaker is called "That's ME!" Here's how it works. Loy and I will be stating a fact about ourselves. If you can relate, you scream out "That's Me!" and raise your hands and wave them around. Loy and I will demonstrate. I like boba!

Calla: Easy enough? Let's get started

Loy: I am currently enrolled or was enrolled in a Family and Consumer Sciences class

Calla: I've memorized the official Opening and Closing Ceremony

Loy: I have participated in a STAR event at a regional level or above

Calla: I have completed at least 5 hours of community service

Loy: Alright guys thanks for playing!

Calla: Okay, HOW MANY of you guys said that's me to at least one of them, most of them, all of them? Next we will talk about the Golden State Degrees. The Golden State Degree program provides FCCLA members the opportunity to earn degrees and recognition at the chapter, region, and state levels.

Loy: As FCCLA members participate in chapter, region, and state activities, they can develop leadership skills and make a plan to achieve an FCCLA Golden State Degree at all levels.

Calla: The golden state degree is a symbol of passing a milestone in FCCLA and means you have grown as a member and are that much closer to making a difference and making your experience in the organization a much more memorable one.

Loy: Yes ma'am

Calla: Here's the thing. the degree applications are like three-four pages

That sounds like a lot of work.

Loy: Well, yes. But, were you able to answer most of the questions, right?

Calla: Yeah, all of them actually!

Loy: That means you're eligible for either your chapter, region, or even state degree.

Calla: No, way

Loy: Just a little more and you'll be that much closer!

Calla: Wait, what's the point of this?

Loy: Welllllll my friend, you get recognized by your fellow members.

Calla: I see.

Loy: You get rewarded for your hard work!!

Loy: You're more involved with FCCLA and your community .

Calla: ok ok ok I see. Wait, how do I do more community service hours to achieve my degree?

Loy: That's a good question. Does anyone have some ideas that you can do to get community service hours? Have you done any hours with your chapter or in your community?

Calla: Sweet! You guys came up with some solid ideas. Those ideas will definitely help you out with the end prize.

Loy: Oh and did I mention that when you receive a degree on any level you get a sweet certificate and pin with it ?

Calla: Check it out ! When you receive your chapter degree you're recognized in front of your WHOLE region at State Leadership Conference with a certificate and a copper pin

Loy: When you receive your region degree you're recognized in front of the ENTIRE state while hundreds of people holla your name while accepting a certificate and silver pin. *points at Loy's pin

Calla: And get this, when you receive your state degree you're given the same as when awarded your region degree, but INSTEAD you receive a gold pin with a RUBY on it and twice as much as recognition. Also,

members who have met all qualifications for multiple degrees shall be entitled to wear only the emblem of the highest degree for which he/she has met all qualifications. So, if you got your chapter and region degree, you wear your region degree pin. I have my state degree pin on right now.

Loy: Make sure to take this info back to your region and chapter!

Calla: At fall meeting, encourage your members to fill out this simple application to get their awards!

Loy: There are PLENTY of ways you can have more members get involved in the Golden State Degree.

Calla: Looks like it's time for another game! This game is called Yanny or Laurel. Here's how to play

Loy: Let's split the room in half. BAM

Calla: This is team Yanny and this is Team Laurel. Loy and I will be asking Trivia questions about FCCLA. Only one person may be up at the desk at a time. If you know the answer you have to shout your team name and answer the question. First team to get 5 questions right, wins!

Calla: What are the FCCLA colors?

Calla: Hm, Loy. Did you hear Yanny?

Loy: I heard Laurel.

Calla: Wait no I heard both!

Loy: Now that you guys know a little more about what the golden state degrees are let's now talk about the national program Power of 1.

Calla: In this national program you put your personal power to use by setting goals, accomplishing them, and watching them pan out and go as planned.

Loy: These goals are a better you..

Calla: Which is basically changing everyday bad habits so you can do something such as working out everyday or eating healthy. Another goal is family ties..

Loy: For example you can accomplish this by simply starting a trend with your family at dinner such as not using your phones for the whole meal! Another is working on working..

Calla: This is you just looking into future careers you are interested in and sitting down with a person in that field and talking about pursuing that career. Another is take the lead.

Loy: This can include running for Chapter Office or presenting at meetings such as your Fall and Spring meetings. You can even accomplish this in your Chapter meetings! Another is speak out for FCCLA..

Calla: You can do this by doing things such as talking about FCCLA with board members or speaking with elected officials about FCCLA.

Loy: Completing this allows you to be acknowledged at State in front of all your peers.

Calla: As well as receiving a super cool pin proving that you completed a national program!

Loy: Here are some applications, we will now give you guys a couple of minutes to make some goals for this application so that you're one step closer to accomplishing it. Work with the person next to you to come up with some of your goals.

Calla: You can also find these applications on the national website. Let's take some time to fill em out!

Calla: Okay, guys! We're going to play a game at this time. So at this time if you can take out your your phones or laptops and we'll play a short game of Kahoot. The code for this game is _____.
