

STAR Event Scripts

Officer #1: Hello fellow members, my name is Alexis Morales, and this is my assistant Taylor Le.

Officer #2: Wait what? I'm your assistant?

Officer #1: Yes my assistant.

Officer #2: No, no no no no I'm not your assistant! I'm your teammate.

Okay!

Officer #1: Okay my teammate Taylor.

Officer #2: So today, we're here to teach you guys all the ropes about STAR Events.

Officer #1: Does anyone know what STAR events are or maybe can even name a few? (*Hear responses*)

Officer #2: Those are some good answers. STAR stands for Students Taking Action with Recognition.

Officer #1: There are three divisions to STAR events: Junior Division, which is 6th-9th grade, Senior division, which is 10th-12th grade.

Officer #2: And occupational, which is a student enrolled in a capstone course.

Officer #1: Certain events can compete at the National level, these are usually marked with a plus sign at the end of each competition name.

Officer #2: There are four categories that all of the events fall in to.

Officer #1: Chapter events are competitions that members in your chapter work together to represent your chapter. Examples are Chapter Review Portfolio, Promote and Publicize FCCLA, Chapter Service Project Display, National Programs in Action, and Parliamentary Procedures.

Officer #2: Team events are competitions that lets you work with a team up to three members. All of these competitions can compete at the National level. Examples are: Sports Nutrition, Applied Math for Culinary Management, Culinary Arts, Entrepreneurship, Environmental Ambassador, Food Innovation, Hospitality, Tourism, and Recreation, Illustrated Talk, Interior Design and Life Event Planning.

Officer #1: These individual events are solo competitions that can go to the National level. Example are: Fashion Design, Job Interview, Nutrition and Wellness, Recycle Garment Fashion Show Contest, and Teach and Train.

Officer #2: California State events are competitions that members can only compete in at Region meetings and the State Leadership Conference.

Example are: Child Development, Culinary Display, Interior Design, Menu Planning and Table Display, Salad Preparation, Fashion Construction only Senior division could go to National.

Officer #1: Before we get further into any other information, let's see which events fit your personality best.

Officer #2: We will need you to take your phone out for this activity. You will have to go on this link and there will be 5 question for you to answer and at the end they will give you some suggestion events you can compete in based on your personality.

Officer #1: Can I have a volunteer to read their result to us. Can I have one more.

Officer #2: Well that was fun. Now that you guys know what STAR events are, what are the benefits for members who participate?

Officer #1: There's a lot benefits because members gains Confidence, Public Speaking Skills, Career Preparedness, Communication, Teamwork, Leadership, Time management skills that they take with them to adulthood.

Officer #2: Really?

Officer #1: Yup, but not just that, there's still so much more benefit for the member.

Officer #2: Oh ya? But did you know-

Officer #1: What? What is it?

Officer #2: Patience, I was going to say you forgot one of the most important achievement member can achieve.

Officer #1: Really, I did? Wait let me think. Nope, I got nothing.

Officer #2: You forgot to mention awards. There's approximately \$650,000 dollars in cash awards and school scholarships given at the state level.

Officer #1: Oh ya huh. I also forgot, you can also can receive medals in region, trophies at state, scholarships, money, and recognition.

Officer #2: Wait, there are different awards at different levels?

Officer #1: Correct, do you remember the award system at the different levels?

Officer #2: I remember that at the region level, all participant will receive a certificate and top 3 participants will receive a bronze, silver, or gold medal. Also, top 7 participants will advance to the State Level of Competition. I can't remember the State level awards though, can you help with them?

Officer #1: The top 3 participants will receive trophies and some competitions have scholarships, cash prizes, and other awards for top participants.

Officer #2: Woaaaa, that sounds so amazing, I just want to compete right now. So what are the steps I have to take to compete.

Officer #1: Well, first off you have to choose what competition you want to compete in, then look at the rules and decide your topic and start from there.

Officer #2: Where do I start?

Officer #1: Taylrrrr. Let me just tell you everything from top to bottom so I don't have to go back and forth.

Officer #2: That would be great

Officer #1: You need a file folder which include the process & evidence of your project and you will present it to the judges.

Officer #2: One big thing that is required in your file folder is the planning process sheet. It help you summarize your competition. If you fill it out correctly, it makes doing your project easier.

Officer #1:First up we have identify concerns. This is where you brainstorm concerns about the topic you chose. Think about what problems are you

going to face while doing this competition. Things such as timing, resources, etc.

Officer #2: The next step is to set a goal. Think about what you really want to accomplish with your project.

Officer #1: The third step is to form a plan. Think about what can you do to achieve your goal using who, what, where, when, why, and also how.

Officer #2: The fourth one is the most nerve racking moment because it's where you going to perform to the judges. However, don't be scared or too worried because you will have enough time to practice.

Officer #1: The last step is follow up. After you finish your project, what are you going to do to follow up on your idea.

Officer #2: Now with everything that has just been discussed, who wants to compete in a STAR event?

Officer #1: Awesome! We're actually going to do two practice STAR Events. The first STAR Event we're going to do it entrepreneurship. We're going to split you guys into groups determined by what colour popsicle stick you have. Wait until we go over the instructions to move to your team.

Officer #2: Each group will have to make their own business related to Family and Consumer Science Education. Each team needs to come up

with a name for the business, a logo, a concept for the business, and a location for the business.

Officer #1: You will have 10 minutes to work on it, after that we will ask you to share to us about your ideas. Any questions?

Officer #2: Okay, let's get started!
