

California Specifications for Virtual Competition

Baking and Pastry

1. The National organization has given the State Advisor instructions to qualify students to compete at the National Leadership Conference in one of several ways. California has chosen to hold one state level competition. The notes on virtual competition in this document are not to be used in anything except the California State Qualifying Competition.
2. Time requirements:
 - The competitor will create a video that will include food preparation, plating, and answers to the two given questions. It will not include participant set-up, room consultant and evaluator review time, or evaluation interview time. The maximum time for the videotape is 125 minutes. A voiceover of the recording or presentation is not allowed. The video file can be an embedded video, video link to YouTube, Vimeo, or Google Drive, but must not require the viewer to download it.
3. At the conclusion of plating, the competitor will state, "This is my final product" followed by the answers to the following two questions:
 - What is one skill that you learned or improved upon during your project that you will use in school next year or in your future career?
 - What obstacles caused challenges in your work, and how did you address them?

3. At the conclusion of plating, the competitor will state, "This is my final product" followed by the answers to the following two questions:
 - What is one skill that you learned or improved upon during your project that you will use in school next year or in your future career?
 - What obstacles caused challenges in your work, and how did you address them?
